The National Assembly for Wales, having consulted those persons which it is required, by section 4(3) of the Local Government Act 1999(1), to consult, makes the following order in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 4(1)(a) and (2) and section 29(1) of that Act.

Name, commencement and application

- 1.—(1) The name of this order is the Local Government (Best Value Performance Indicators) (Wales) Order 2005 and it comes into force on 1 April 2005.
 - (2) This order applies only in relation to Wales.

Performance Indicators

2. The performance indicators specified for county and county borough councils, including, where appropriate, performance indicators in relation to the exercise by them of functions as waste disposal authorities, are, in relation to the functions identified in the table below, the performance indicators set out in that table.
